

October 2016 MINUTES

PHA held its monthly meeting on October 13, 2016 at 7:00 pm, with 73 members in attendance and 10 new interested members. The meeting was held under the direction of the club President, Neil Evens, at Skippers Seafood.

REPORTS:

- A. Minutes were read by Austin Cooper for the September 2016 Meeting.
- B. Gerald Morgan gave a balance in checking account as of September 2016 — The BB&T account for the month of September 2016 had a starting balance of \$50,387.94 with total deposits of \$71,781.50 with \$2,398.33 in expenditures. This left an ending balance of \$119,646.11.
- C. Plate Match – the July, 2016 match had 18 shooters and turned in \$210.00.

- E. Concealed Carry — \$28.00 for the month of September.
- F. Shotgun Range - Barry Hedgecock turned in \$1119.00 for September.
- G. .22 Match – For 9/10/2016 – 22 shooters and took in \$110.00.

- I. Tactical Match – For 7/16/2016 – 45 shooters, \$640.00
- J. Defensive Pistol – N/A.

All minutes were read and approved without any additions.

- 1-) Our open house is still on for September 24, 2016. This year we will add a members swap meet. Tables are available to rent for \$20.00 or bring your own.

- 3-) The Junior Order Home Christmas party – We will pass the hat next month, cash or check is welcome. Our PHA Benevolence fund will match the dollar amount.
- 4-) In September, we should receive a new quote for the berm removal and wall construction.
- 5-) The Building – The contractor is working directly with the County Building office and is providing the necessary technical drawings for approval. As for fees, we do not have a dollar amount as of 09/08/2016. The building will not be used for our open house.
- 6-) Planning for the open house was discussed as for venues, ammo, food and volunteers. All range activities will be in 100 yard range area.
- 7-) PHA will begin using disposable member cards for new members while they wait for their permanent card.

- 8-) A painted lock will be added to the gate for our range matches. The combination will be changed for every match. This will facilitate our guest being able to leave when needed and keep the gate locked during matches.
- 9-) The Davidson County Long Beards wish to use the PHA range for their Jakes Day on March 11, 2017. They will provide the targets and ammo. We will need volunteers to help with the event. A motion to allow this was made by Ray Owens with a second by Nat Gosh. Agreed to by all attending.
- 10) We need to update the match descriptions and add the match directors contact info.

New Business

- 2-) The Berm project is still in motion without a firm quote for the cost. There will be an Update next month.
- 3-) Dave Rodgers inquired about a monthly financial report from the Benevolence Committee. This is in progress for the future meetings. Roy Buncombe's wife has a long-term illness, a \$50.00 check and card will be sent to them from PHA. A motion was made by Dick Jones with a second by Kenny Vanadore, all attending in favor.
- 4-) The Building – All of the paper work and plans are at the county building inspector's office and we are waiting for an inspector to perform the final walk thru.
- 5-) We passed the hat for the annual Children's home Christmas party. A total of \$1,382.21 has been donated at the meeting. The PHA Benevolence Committee donated a matching amount. In addition, funds were taken in for the NCHP Give a Kid a Christmas.
- 6-) Randy Ranford donated some materials to help treat our entrance road for dust control.
- 7-) Dick Jones announced an upcoming Veteran's event at Blue Horizon on November 12, 2016. Volunteers are needed.
- 8-) Ray Owens had a request to help with finances for the Young Marines and their trip to Pearl Harbor in December. The hat was passed in order to have the money available for them by the end of October.
A motion was made by Dick Jones to match up to \$400.00 from the Benevolence Committee. Ray Owens seconded this. All attending agreed.
