

June 13, 2019 Minutes

PHA held its monthly meeting on June 13, 2019 at 7:00 pm with 61 members in attendance and 9 new interested members. The meeting was held under the direction of the Club President, Ray Owens, at Ocean View Seafood.

This meeting was opened with the saying of the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and the thanking of our Lord with a short prayer.

NEW BUSINESS

1. We have a new Match Director for the Tactical Matches, Gene Smitley. He will run a 2-gun and 3-gun match on the same course. All pistol targets will be steel. Rifle shots will be scored on paper. But we don't have the steel targets necessary for this match. We need \$3500 to cover the cost of steel, stands and other miscellaneous costs to get started.
Motion by Richard Moore to approve \$3500 for purchase of steel targets, target stands, and other supplies as needed for the Tactical Match. 2nd. Discussion. Match will be shot on the 2nd Saturday starting on July 13. Passed.
2. 22 people showed up for Range Safety Officer training on June 1. All 22 are now NRA certified as Range Safety Officers. Thanks to these people that gave up some of their Saturday time to show up and receive this training. This makes these 22 people a valuable resource to the Club.
There will be another RSO training class soon. Most likely during the week in August. Let Ray know or sign up directly with me.
3. Wayne Hemphill lost his Chronology book at the High-Power range. If anyone has found the logbook, please contact Wayne or me.
4. Dave Roberts provided an update to the Hanes property. It appears that Davidson County would support approving a Special Use permit, but we may need some legal help with the proper wording on the application. (**Quote:** Looking at PHA non-profit as one entity, and being the applicant for the Special Use Permit, as long as there is something in the chain of command or chain of title, that stipulated that should anything happen between the relationship with Range and the non-profit, it would nullify the Special Use permit, the County sees that as being favorable.)
Dave now recommends that PHA proceed with the process to acquire the property.
Ray asked Glen Winfrey to make an assessment as to the value of the property and what our offer should be for the 17.02 acres.
5. Ray talked about the bridge on the 100-yard range. Ray queried Dave and Austin about they had found out about pricing to replace the bridge. Good discussion continued. Ray would like for Rob Fritts of LTP to gather the estimates that have already been given and Ray will try to get another estimate as well. Ray would like for LTP meet with the Board on June 25 with all estimates.
Dave Roberts said he did find a couple of places where equipment (mini excavator) could be rented so that we could do some of our own work around the range. **Future Board Topic.**
6. Ray talked about a coupon that will be enclosed in the membership renewal envelope. This coupon will allow the member to one free round at a match that they have never shot before. We just want everyone to try out something new. Some matches have extra club guns that you can use. You just need to let the Match Director ahead of time.
7. Malcom Maske talked to us about US LawShield and explained what their program was and how it worked. If PHA sets up a PHA-specific code with US LawShield, PHA will get \$30 for each PHA member that signs up.
8. Ray talked about the Bylaw revisions. Copies were passed out prior to the start of the meeting.
Motion: Cody Reed made a motion to table a vote on the revised Bylaws until the next General

Meeting in order to have time to review the changes. 2nd. Discussion. Passed.
Bylaws will be posted on the PHA web site for further review.
